GSC's study abroad programs offer the same benefits as the more traditional programs, with some added benefits, including:

- Field experience opportunities tailored more to your individual skills and interests, including: <u>Global Public Health</u>, <u>Child and Orphan Care</u>, <u>Teaching</u> <u>English</u>, <u>Community Development and Leadership Training</u>, and <u>Buddhist</u> <u>Immersion/Teaching English</u>. You can also combine two or more programs for an <u>Integrated Program</u>.
